This petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.0118 dated 07.10.2019 under Sections 148, 149, 323, 506 & 307 (added later on) of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Naggal, District Ambala. The petitioner apprehended his arrest at the hands of Police, in the above FIR.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has invited the attention of the Court to the order dated 27.12.2019, whereby while issuing notice of motion to respondent-State, the interim protection was extended to the petitioner. The said order reads as under:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that originally the FIR was registered for the offence punishable under Sections 323, 506, 34 IPC, however, subsequently the offence punishable under Section 307 IPC was added in respect of the injury suffered

by victim Megh Raj. It is contended that the said injury is not attributed to the petitioner, which is caused by other co-accused.

Notice of motion for 14.5.2020.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner further contends that in deference to the said order, the petitioner submitted himself before the Police and joined the investigation. According to him, the petitioner cooperated with the Police Authorities during the investigation and furnished requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer.

Learned State counsel who is assisted by SI Om Parkash does not dispute this fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for custodial interrogation for the time being.

Considering the above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 27.12.2019 is made absolute.
