And/or for a direction to the respondents to reinstate the petitioner on his post with all consequential and ancillary benefits of service and consequently also pay all arrears of salary as well as the emoluments of arrears of salary due since 01.04.2019. And / or pass such any other order / orders which may deem fit and proper.”

6. The petitioner has already invoked the remedy of appeal before the Appellate Authority on 16.01.2020 and it is pending consideration.

7. Therefore, the Appellate Authority is hereby directed to decide the appeal of the petitioner in accordance with law within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.
