ORAL ORDER

(Per: HONOURABLE THE CHIEF JUSTICE)

2 03-01-2022 Petitioner has prayed for the following relief(s):-

“For issuance of writ in the nature of certiorari to quash the order dated 21-04-2020 passed by respondent no. 2 and also the order dated 26-12-2018 passed by respondent no. 3 by which he imposed the penalty of Termination of Agency of the petitioner under Rule 16(1)(A) and 16(1)(B) of the L.I.C. of India (Agent) Regulation 2017 and also ordered for forfeiture of renewal commission payable to him under Rule 19(2) with immediate effect and further for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus



and /or any other appropriate writ/order/direction commanding upon the respondents to restore the Agency of the petitioner and release the renewal commission payable to him.”

After the matter was heard for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the present petition reserving liberty to approach the Chairman, L.I.C. of India under Rule 24 of L.I.C. of India (Agents) Regulation, 2017 by filing a memorial for redressal of the grievances.

Prayer allowed.

The present petition is, accordingly, disposed of as withdrawn with the liberty aforesaid. If such a memorial is filed by the petitioner within the stipulated time, the authority concerned is directed to consider the same and dispose it of expeditiously and preferably within a period of six months thereafter.

Needless to say that while considering such request, principles of natural justice shall be followed and due opportunity of hearing afforded to the parties.

If aggrieved by the said order, the petitioner shall have liberty to approach this Court by way of separate petition(s), if so required and desired.



Interlocutory application, if any, shall also stand
disposed of.
