ORAL ORDER

(Per: HONOURABLE THE CHIEF JUSTICE)

2 03-01-2022 Petitioner has prayed for the following relief(s):

“(a) For quashing the entire certificate proceeding bearing Certificate Case No. 1 of 2019-20 styled as District Manager, State Food Corporation, Arwal verses Shri Rajendra Jha (contract) then Assistant Manager, Karpi pending in the court of District Certificate Officer, Arwal.

(b) To grant such other relief/relieves as the petitioner may be found entitled to in the facts and circumstances of the case.”



After the matter was heard for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the present petition reserving liberty to file a fresh petition (objection petition) before the authority concerned for redressal of the grievances within a period of four weeks.

Prayer allowed.

The present application is, accordingly, disposed of as withdrawn with the liberty aforesaid.

Shri Harish Kumar, learned counsel for the B.S.F.C., states that if such an objection petition is filed within the time stipulated above, limitation shall not be allowed to come in the way of its consideration and decision on merits since the petitioner has been pursuing remedies before this Hon'ble Court.

If such a petition is filed by the petitioner within the stipulated time, the authority concerned is directed to consider the same and dispose it of expeditiously and preferably within the statutory period of six months thereafter.

Needless to say that while considering such request, principles of natural justice shall be followed and due opportunity of hearing afforded to the parties.

If aggrieved by the said order, the petitioner shall



have liberty to approach this Court by way of separate petition(s), if so required and desired.

Interlocutory application, if any, shall also stand disposed of.
