2 24-08-2022 Heard the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioners undertakes to remove the defects within four weeks of resumption of normal court proceedings. In the eventuality of non-removal of defects within stipulated period, office will place the matter before the Bench.

The petitioners apprehend their arrest in a case registered for the offence punishable under section 341, 323, 324, 307, 379, 504, 506, 34 of the IPC.

Allegedly, the petitioners along with others assaulted the informant by means of knife due to which he sustained injuries

It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioners that petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. They



have been falsely implicated in this case due to dirty village politics. No such occurrence, in the manner as alleged, has ever taken place. The allegation leveled against the petitioner is not specific rather general and omnibus in nature. There is an admitted land dispute between the parties. He further submits that the injuries are simple in nature. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent, as also mentioned in para-3 of the bail application.

Learned APP for the State opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, since the injuries are simple in nature, let the above named petitioners be released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of six weeks from today, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) **each** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below where the case is pending/Successor Court in Rohtas P.S. Case No.248 of 2021, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
