2 12-12-2022 Though the present writ petition was filed for directing the Respondents to pay 20% extra salary to the petitioners in view of Section 100 of the Bihar Service Code but the Respondents have filed a counter affidavit, wherein it has been stated that the case of the petitioner no. 2 has been



rejected, vide letter dated 20.11.2014, issued by the Chief Engineer, Water Resources Department, Siwan and as far as the petitioners no. 1 and 3 are concerned, they are working only on one independent post at a time, hence, their claim is not tenable in the eyes of law.

Having regard to the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, I deem it fit and proper to dispose of the present writ petition, with liberty to the petitioners to re-agitate their grievances before the Respondent authorities, by filing a comprehensive representation, enclosing ample proof and materials to buttress their claim.
