3 29-11-2022 The petitioner has prayed for the following relief/s :-

- I) For issuance of an appropriate Writ , order or direction to the Respondent bank to release the A.C Bus having registration No. BR 06 PB/9099 as the same has been seized illegally by the Seizure of the bank on 8/5/2019 from Dhanki More Patna Vide Annexure 9 of the petition when the bus was coming from Madhubani to Patna by taking passengers without any prior notice to



the petitioner and without having any such order from the appropriate authority.

- II) For further direction to the respondents to act in accordance with law so that the petitioner may not have to suffer any difficulty in future in clearing his dues for bringing out his ^{boat} out of loan.
- III) For issuance of an appropriate writ, order or direction to respondent bank to give possession of the seized vehicle with all accessories and articles fitted with the vehicle and also for giving compensation to the petitioner as by the illegal and whimsical act of the respondent bank the petitioner has to suffer an irreparable loss and injury in terms of money and prestige.
- IV) For further direction to the respondent bank to audit the all transactions made by the petitioner in his account so that the clear picture may emerge.
- V) For grant of any other relief or reliefs to which the petitioner is legally entitled to in the facts and circumstances of the case.

It is stated at the Bar that the parties have settled the dispute outside the Court.

As such, learned counsel for the petitioner does not want to press the present petition.



The instant petition stands disposed of as not pressed.
