The instant petition has been filed for initiation of
contempt proceedings against the opposite parties for



deliberately and wilfully not complying with the judgment dated 21.12.2017 passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWJC No. 12505 of 2017, titled as Birendra Nath Verma & Ors. Vs. The State of Bihar & Ors.
