learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the State

through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks regular bail in connection with
Barari P.S. Case No. 129/2021 registered for the offences
punishable under Sections 302/34 of the Indian Penal Code
1860 and Section 27 of the Arms Act.

The allegation in nutshell is that about seven
named accused persons arrived at the house of the
informant where the father-in-law of the informant was
sleeping and they fired upon her father-in-law, due to which,
he sustained injuries near his chest and nose and died.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that



from perusal of the First Information Report it would be evident that the petitioner is not the assailant and in the second part of the FIR the informant has stated that the Mukhiya Rakesh Yadav hatched the conspiracy and got the father-in-law of the informant killed by named accused persons. In the last line of the FIR a vague statement has been given by the informant that the petitioner was also involved in the present offence. Learned counsel further submits that allegation against the petitioner is vague and he has been implicated in this case with oblique motive. The petitioner is in custody since 30.6.2021 and charge sheet has already been submitted.

Regards being had to the submission made by the parties and taking into consideration the materials on record, the fact that the petitioner is not the assailant, he is in custody since 30.6.2021 and charge sheet has already been submitted, I am inclined to grant regular bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, let the petitioner, above named, be released on regular bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.20,000/- (Twenty thousand) with two sureties of the like



amount each to the satisfaction of learned A.C.J.M. III,
Katihar, in connection with Barari P.S. Case No. 129/2021.
