4 18-04-2022 The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners have filed Title Suit No. 49 of 2018 which is pending in the court of Sub Judge Benipatti. He makes a prayer for a direction for expeditious disposal of the case. The suit was



admitted on 26.09.2018. The defendants filed their written statement on 11.03.2019.
