2 16-06-2022 The learned counsel for the petitioner is directed to remove all the defects pointed out by the Stamp Reporter within one month.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned APP for the State.

The petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in connection with Jamhor P.S. Case No. 84 of 2021, registered for the offences under Sections 379, 411/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

The main submissions advanced by learned counsel for the petitioner are that the date and time of alleged theft has not been mentioned in the FIR and the allegation made in respect of the said offence is completely vague and the alleged place of the recovery which is stated to be the field of this petitioner is situated 2 km away from the petitioner's house and the



same is an open place and no one has claimed to be the eye witness of the alleged stealing and no one has seen this petitioner hiding the alleged theft articles in his filed.

Learned APP has vehemently opposed the prayer of bail.

Having Considered the above submissions and petitioners' clean antecedent mentioned at paragraph 3 of the petition and place of recovery which is stated to be an open place, let the petitioner, above named, in the event of his arrest/surrender within four weeks from today in the Court below, be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/-(Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of concerned Court in connection with Jamhor P.S. Case No. 84 of 2021, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
