ORAL ORDER

2 10-08-2022 Though the present writ petition has been filed to quash the proceedings in connection with Encroachment case no. 02 of 2019-20, initiated by the Circle Officer, Simri Bakhtiyarpur Circle, Simri Bakhtiyarpur, District – Saharsa i.e. the respondent no. 7, however relying upon the order ***dated 28.07.2022***, passed in ***C.W.J.C. no. 20131 of 2021***, the learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that no order has been passed under ***Section 6(1) of the Bihar Public Land Encroachment Act, 1956***, till date, hence, it is submitted that



the petitioner be granted liberty to approach the respondent no. 7 to enable him to file his objections/ show cause reply and the respondent no. 7 be directed to pass final orders under ***Section 6(1) of the Act, 1956.***

The learned counsel appearing for the respondent- State submits that in case, appropriate objection is filed within a stipulated time frame, appropriate order shall be passed thereon, expeditiously.

Accordingly, the present writ petition stands disposed off, however with liberty to the petitioner to file objections/ show cause reply before the respondent no. 7 in the aforesaid Encroachment case, within a period of four weeks from today, whereupon the respondent no. 7 shall consider the same and pass final order under ***Section 6(1) of the Act, 1956,*** within a period of twelve weeks, thereafter. It is needless to state that for a period of sixteen weeks from today, *status quo* existing as on today, shall be maintained.
