Affidavit-of-service filed in Court today is taken on record.

The petitioner happens to be the widow of the deceased primary school teacher. The husband of the petitioner expired on **16.02.2016**.

The petitioner claims that she became a widow on **16.02.2016** and PPO for family pension was issued in her favour on **10.11.2016** and disbursed on 20.12.2016. The petitioner claims interest on delayed payment of the family pension in her favour.

There is nothing on record to show that the petitioner applied for family pension after the death of her husband.

There is no averment in the writ petition with regard to the date on which the petitioner applied for grant of family pension in her favour.

There is nothing on record to show that there was any delay on the part of the respondents in releasing the family pension in favour of the petitioner herein.

In view of the above, no relief can be granted in favour of the petitioner in the present writ petition.

The writ petition fails and is hereby dismissed.
