Mr. Anirban Mitra, learned advocate appears for the petitioners.

Record shows that the notice of this application has not been served on the opposite parties.

The petitioners by filing the present application under Article 227 of the Constitution of India have prayed for expeditious disposal of Title Suit No. 152 of 2015 (Registration No. 445 of 2015), pending before the learned Civil Judge (Junior Division) 1st Court, Basirhat.

The learned advocate for the petitioners submits that the learned Court below has been granting unnecessary adjournments and due to which, there is a delay in disposal of the case and such delay is causing hardship to the petitioners.

Having regard to the nature of relief claimed by the petitioners, being a prayer for expeditious disposal of the title suit, I do not find any need to serve notice of the present application on the opposite parties and it is not likely to cause any prejudice to the interest of the

opposite parties. Therefore, service of notice upon the opposite parties is dispensed with.

The learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 1st Court, Basirhat, is requested to dispose of Title Suit No. 152 of 2015 (Registration No. 445 of 2015), as expeditiously as possible and in any event, within a period of six months from the date of communication of this order, without granting any adjournment whatsoever to any of the parties, as the suit is pending since 2015.

Accordingly, the revisional application being **C.O. 236 of 2022** is disposed of.

There shall be no order as to costs.
