Petitioners seek anticipatory bail.

Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners were falsely implicated. The petitioners became aware of the police case after the submission of charge-sheet.

Learned Advocate appearing for the State submits that the petitioners were absconding for a period of two years. He submits that the police however filed charge-sheet.

Considering the gravity of the offence and the involvement of the petitioners therein and considering the fact that the police filed charge-sheet, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and with a further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the Court below and pray for regular bail within four weeks from

date and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the Court below on every date fixed for hearing.

The prayer for anticipatory bail is allowed.
