CRM (A) 1277 of 2022

In Re: - An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Hanskhali** P.S. Case No. **273 of 2020** dated **28/06/2020** under Sections **498A/304B/34** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860.

Petitioners seek anticipatory bail.

Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the police filed charge-sheet and, therefore, custodial interrogation of the petitioners are not required. Moreover, the husband and the father-in-law of the victim are on bail.

Learned Advocate appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the fact that the petitioners withdrew two previous applications for anticipatory bail.

Considering the fact that the police filed charge-sheet and considering the gravity of the offence and the involvement of the petitioners therein and considering the fact that the husband and the father-in-law of the victim were granted bail by the jurisdictional Court, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a Bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that

the petitioners shall appear every day before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioners in Court including the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners is allowed.

CRM (A) 1277 of 2022 is, thus disposed of.
