Petitioners seek anticipatory bail.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are landless labourers. They are trying to repair their house.

Learned advocate appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the materials in the case diary.

Considering the gravity of the offence and the involvement of petitioners therein, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal

Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioners shall report before the Investigating Officer once in a month till the conclusion of the investigation and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear every day before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioners in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners is **allowed.**

CRM(A) 1578 of 2022 is **disposed of.**
