Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that the marriage stood dissolved by a decree passed on September 30, 2021. The police complaint was lodged subsequent thereto.

State is represented.

Considering the materials in the case diary and considering the fact that marriage stood dissolved by a decree dated September 30, 2021 and considering the fact that police complaint was lodged subsequent thereto, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the

arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioner shall report before the Investigating Officer at such time and place as may be specified by the Investigating Officer till the conclusion of the investigation and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear every day before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is **allowed.**

CRM (A) 1608 of 2022 is disposed **of.**
