In re : An Application for **Anticipatory Bail** under Section **438** of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Ratua** Police Station Case No. **435** of **2021** dated **27.08.2021** under Sections **498A/494/325/436/506/376/511/34** of Indian Penal Code subsequently Charge Sheet being no. **49/2022** dated **31.01.2022** under Sections **498A /494 /323 /376 / 511 /506/34** of the Indian Penal Code against 6 accused persons including the petitioner.

Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail.

Learned advocate appealing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner was falsely implicated. The husband is in custody. The police filed charge sheet and, therefore, custodial interrogation of the petitioner is not required.

Learned advocate appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the statements of the victim recorded under Sections 161 and 164 of the Criminal Procedure Code.

Considering the fact that police filed charge sheet and considering the fact that husband is in custody, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two

sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear every day before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is **allowed.**

CRM (A) 1665 of 2022 is **disposed of.**
