This is an application seeking an expeditious disposal of a proceeding in which a charge sheet was submitted under section 21 (c) of the N.D.P.S. Act.

Let a copy of the revisional application be served upon Mr. Tanmay Kumar Ghosh and Mr. Pratick Bose, learned counsels, who ordinarily appear on behalf of the State. They are requested to appear in this matter. Their engagement may be regularised by the competent authority of the State in due course.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits as follows. The petitioner is an accused in this case. He is in custody since 06.03.2020, the date on which the F.I.R. was registered. Charge sheet was submitted in 2020. Supplementary Charge sheet was submitted in 2021. On 26.09.2021 charge was framed. Although eleven witnesses were proposed to be examined, till date only one witness could be examined. The impugned proceeding has remained pending for no fault on the part of the petitioner.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State submits that State would not come in the way if a direction is passed for an expeditious disposal of the proceeding.

I have heard the submissions of the learned counsels appearing for the petitioner and the State and have perused the revision petition.

It appears that an inordinate delay has been occasioned in concluding the trial, especially considering the fact that the petitioner is languishing in custody since 06.03.2020.

In view of the above and in the interest of justice, the learned Trial Court is requested to conclude the trial as expeditiously as possible without granting any unnecessary adjournment to any of the parties, preferably within ten months from the next date of hearing.

With these observations, the revisional application is disposed of.
