Mr. Malay Bhattacharyya, learned advocate
appears for the petitioner.

Record shows that the notice of this application
has not been served on the opposite party.

The petitioner by filing the present application
under Article 227 of the Constitution of India has
prayed for expeditious disposal of the suit being
Ejectment Suit No. 4 of 2014, pending before the
learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 2nd Court at
Alipore.

The learned advocate for the petitioner submits
that the learned Court below has been granting
unnecessary adjournments and due to which, there is a
delay in disposal of the case and such delay is causing
hardship to the petitioner.

Having regard to the nature of relief claimed by the petitioner, being a prayer for expeditious disposal of the ejectment suit, I do not find any need to serve notice of the present application on the opposite party and it is not likely to cause any prejudice to the interest of the opposite party. Therefore, service of notice upon the opposite party is dispensed with.

The learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 2nd Court at Alipore, is requested to dispose of Ejectment Suit No. 4 of 2014, as expeditiously as possible and in any event, within a period of six months from the date of communication of this order, without granting any adjournment whatsoever to any of the parties, as the suit is pending since 2014.

Accordingly, the revisional application being **C.O. 991 of 2021** is disposed of.

There shall be no order as to costs.
