The petitioner has filed this revisional application challenging the order dated March 23, 2017 passed by the learned Executive Magistrate, Sadar, Hooghly in M.P. Case No. 262 of 2017 under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code.

As per Section 144(4) of the Criminal Procedure Code no order under this Section shall remain in force for more than 2 months from making thereof. Needless to mention the order has been passed on March 23, 2017, so two months as per statute has already elapsed long ago.
