Petitioners seek anticipatory bail.

Learned Advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the husband of the victim is in custody. The death is due to suicide.

Learned Advocate appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the post-mortem report of the victim and the materials in the case diary.

Considering the post-mortem report of the victim and the materials in the case diary, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a Bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only) each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioner no.1, namely, Rumi Barman

(Mandal), will cooperate with the investigation till the conclusion of the investigation and the petitioner no.2, namely, Dhana Gopal Barman, will report before the Investigating Officer once a fortnight till the conclusion of the investigation and on condition that the petitioners shall appear every day before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default, the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioners in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

The prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners is allowed.

C.R.M. (A) 2231 of 2022 is disposed of.
