It is contended that the incident occurred ten years after marriage.

Learned lawyer for the State opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

We have considered materials on record. It appears the injuries were suffered by the victim lady in the course of scuffle arising out of a domestic quarrel.

Keeping in mind the aforesaid facts and as injuries are simple in nature, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that while on bail petitioner shall meet the investigating officer once in a week until further orders.

Petitioner shall appear before the court below and prays for regular bail within four weeks from date.

The application being CRM (A) 2639 of 2022 is disposed of.
