Heard the learned advocate appearing for both the parties.

Having considered the materials on record and bearing in mind the nature of allegations in the light of the submission there is a long standing family feud and as injuries do not appear to be grievous or life-threatening, we are of the opinion custodial interrogation of the accused/petitioners may not be necessary in the facts of the present case and they may be granted anticipatory bail.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the accused/petitioners, namely **(1) Pradip Rajbanshi, (2) Kishore Rajbanshi, (3) Madhab Rajbanshi, (4) Ganesh Rajbanshi, (5) Anup Rajbanshi, (6) Biswajit Rajbanshi, (7) Latika Rajbanshi & (8) Putul Rajbanshi**, be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) each, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioners shall

appear before the court below and pray for regular bail within four weeks from date.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
