Petitioner prays for anticipatory bail.

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that, the petitioner was falsely implicated.

Learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the State draws the attention of the Court to the materials in the case diary including the post mortem report of the victim and the statement of the doctor conducting the post mortem, recorded under Section 161 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (Cr.P.C.). He also refers to the criminal antecedent of the petitioner.

Considering the fact that the police filed charge-sheet and considering the post mortem report of the victim and the 161 Cr.P.C. statement of the doctor conducting the post mortem, we deem it appropriate to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/-, with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that the petitioner shall appear every day before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

This application for anticipatory bail is, thus, allowed.
