This is an application for cancellation of bail of the opposite party No.1, granted by the learned Chief Judge, City Sessions Court at Calcutta on 7th May, 2015.

After filing the instant application the petitioner has not taken any positive step to get the matter heard. The opposite party No.1 is enjoying the liberty of bail for the last seven years.

At this stage, I am not inclined to cancel the order of bail granted by the learned Chief Judge, City Sessions Court at Calcutta in Criminal Miscellaneous Case No.254 of 2015.

No.1 expeditiously and preferably within six months from the date of communication of this order.

The application is, thus, disposed of.
