In re : An Application for **Anticipatory Bail** under Section **438** of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Kaliachak** Police Station Case No. **1429** of **2021** dated **24.12.2021** under Sections **21(C)/22(C)/29/27A** of the NDPS Act.

The police are proceeding against the petitioner on the basis of the statements of the co-accused made while in custody. The police filed charge sheet. No narcotic was recovered from the possession of the petitioner. The police, at this stage, are unable to establish any nexus between the petitioner and the seized commercial quantity of narcotic and the arrested co-accused.

In such circumstances, we are of the view that the petitioner is able to overcome the restrictions under Section 37 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Consequently, we are inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the arresting officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section

438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is **allowed**.

CRM (A) 3651 of 2022 is disposed of.
