Mr. Anindya Halder, learned advocate appears for the petitioner.

Record shows that the notice of this application has not been served on the opposite parties.

The petitioner by filing the present application under Article 227 of the Constitution of India has prayed for expeditious disposal of the suit being Title Suit No. 150 of 2017, pending before the learned Civil Judge (Senior Division), Sealdah.

The learned advocate for the petitioner submits that the learned Court below has been granting unnecessary adjournments and due to which, there is a delay in disposal of the case and such delay is causing hardship to the petitioner.

Having regard to the nature of relief claimed by the petitioner, being a prayer for expeditious disposal of the title suit, I do not find any need to serve notice of the present application on the opposite parties and it is not likely to cause any prejudice to the interest of the opposite parties. Therefore, service of notice upon the opposite parties is dispensed with.

The learned Civil Judge (Senior Division), Sealdah, is requested to dispose of the suit being Title Suit No. 150 of 2017, as expeditiously as possible and in any event, within a period of one year from the date of communication of this order, without granting any adjournment whatsoever to any of the parties, but being regard to the diary maintained by him/her.

Accordingly, the revisional application being **C.O. 2066 of 2021** is disposed of.

There shall be no order as to costs.
