In Re: - An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in connection with **Bagdah** Police Station Case No. **424** of **2022** dated **08.06.2022** under Sections **143/186/333/353/188/307/341/290/120B** of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 and under Section **9** of the West Bengal Maintenance of Public Order Act and under Section **3** of the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act; corresponding to G.R. Case No.1847 of 2022.

Petitioner prays for anticipatory bail.

The materials in the case diary suggest that the injuries are simple in nature. There is no statement as against the petitioner implicating the petitioner in the offences alleged.

In such circumstances, we grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, we direct that in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a Bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand Only), with two sureties of like amount each, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 and on condition that the petitioner will report before the Investigating Officer as and when called for till the conclusion of the investigation and on condition that the petitioner shall appear on every date before the jurisdictional Court on and from the date fixed for appearance of the accused and in default the jurisdictional Court will pass

appropriate order to secure the presence of the petitioner in Court including cancelling the anticipatory bail granted without further reference to this Court.

Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner is allowed.

C.R.M. (A) 4009 of 2022 is, thus, disposed of.
