

WPA 19198 of 2022

Bharat Sevashram Sangha & Anr.
Vs.
The State of W. B. & Ors.

Affidavit of service filed on behalf of the petitioner is taken on record.

None appears for the respondents despite service.

Mr. Chandi Charan De, who usually appears for the State and is present in Court, is requested to represent the State in the matter. His appointment be regularized by the office of the learned Legal Remembrancer.

The petitioner should serve copy of the writ petition alongwith all annexures thereto to Mr. De in course of this day.

Heard learned counsels for the parties.

The grievance of the petitioners is that the private respondent is raising unauthorised construction by encroaching upon a portion of the PWD Road adjacent to the establishment of the petitioners thereby obstructing their egress and ingress.

The petitioners submitted a representation in this regard before the concerned authority on 8th July, 2022, which is yet to be disposed of. The petitioners pray for

direction upon the authority to consider the representation at the earliest.

It is submitted on behalf of the State respondents that the 9th respondent may be directed to deal with the representation, in accordance with law.

In view of the above, the writ petition is disposed of directing the 9th respondent to consider and dispose of the representation submitted by the petitioners dated 8th July, 2022 within three months from the date of communication of this order after affording reasonable opportunity of hearing to all the interested parties including the petitioners and the private respondents, in accordance with law.

With the above observations and directions, the writ petition being WPA 19198 of 2022 is disposed of.

However, there shall be no order as to costs.

Since no affidavit is invited, the allegations contained in the petition are deemed not to be admitted.
