A direction to secure expeditious disposal of Title Suit No. 332 of 2010, pending before the learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 1st Court, Barasat, is the ultimate relief sought for in this case.

Mr. Satyam Mukherjee, learned advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that the suit is getting delayed due to non disposal of an interlocutory application filed by the petitioners/plaintiffs under Section 7(3) of the West Bengal Premises Tenancy Act.

No other point is raised requiring address by this Court.

In view of the nature of the order proposed to be made in the case, no prior notice is considered to be necessary.

Service upon the opposite parties is thus dispensed with.

Accordingly, learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), 1st Court, Barasat in Title Suit No. 332 of 2010 is requested to ensure expeditious disposal of referred suit, after causing disposal of interlocutory application mentioned hereinabove, providing

sufficient opportunity of hearing to either of the parties to this case, but without granting unnecessary adjournment, unless it is extremely unavoidable.

While endeavouring such exercise, the pending interlocutory application may be disposed of, preferably before the end of March, 2023.

Petitioners are directed to make communication of this order to the learned court below as well as to the learned advocate appearing in the court below for the opposite parties and the opposite parties.

With this observation and direction, the revisional application stands disposed of.
