2. Heard.

3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to opposite parties to allow the petitioner to resume his previous duty as Home Guard on the basis of the acquittal order passed by the learned ASJ-cum-C.J.M., Keonjhar.

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made a representation to opposite party No.2 vide Annexure-7 and the same may be directed to be considered within a stipulated time, taking into consideration Annexure-5.

5. Considering the limited grievance of the petitioner, this Court, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the writ petition directing opposite party No.2 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-7, taking into consideration Annexure-5, and pass appropriate order in accordance with law within a period of three months from the date of production of certified/authenticated copy this order.
