This matter is taken up through video conferencing mode.

2. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties to release the un-paid arrear salary for the months of January, February, March, 2021 as the petitioner working under Atithi Teacher Scheme as a Guest Teacher in Dhruba Charan Vidya Mandir, Aliha in the district of Balasore pursuant to the letter vide office order dated 20.01.2021 under Annexure-3 within a stipulated time.

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made representation to the opposite party no.2 vide Annexure-4 and the same may be directed to be disposed of within a stipulated time, to which learned State Counsel has raised no objection.

4. As agreed by learned counsel for the parties, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the writ petition directing opposite party no.2 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-4, and pass appropriate order in accordance with

law within a period of three months from the date of production/communication of certified/authenticated copy of this order.
