The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties to allow him the notional benefit of promotion from the date after three years of his possession of trained graduate qualification i.e. 28.03.1995 and extend the actual benefit of T.G. Scale of pay w.e.f. 01.01.2006.

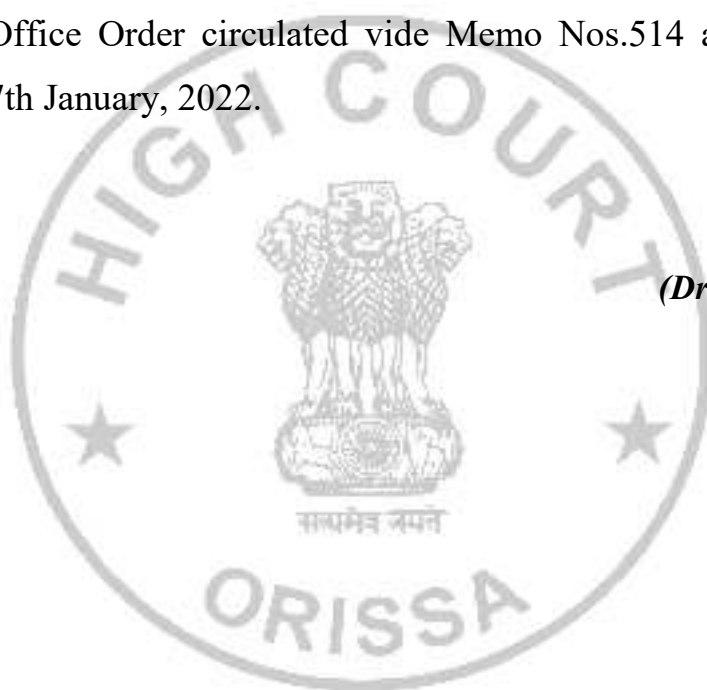

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made representation to the opposite party no.2 vide Annexure-5 series and the same may be directed to be disposed of within a stipulated time, to which learned State Counsel has raised no objection.

Annexure-5 series, and pass appropriate order in accordance with law within a period of three months from the date of production/communication of certified/authenticated copy of this order.
