3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties to regularize the E.P.F. by deducting the same from 3/2009 to 1/2013 at Balasore and again from 4/2006 to 3/2017 at Bhadrak.

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made a representation to opposite party No.3 vide Annexure-2 and the same may be directed to be considered within a stipulated time, to which learned counsel for the State has no objection.
