4. Taking into account such compromise and in view of the principle laid down by the Apex Court in the case of ***Manoj***

Agarwal & Another v. The State of Uttar Pradesh & Another dated 04.03.2022 in SLP (CRL) No.(s) 8242/2021, the proceeding in connection with G.R. Case No.361 of 2010 further corresponding to S.T. Case No.24 of 2019/35 of 2012, arising out of Konark P.S. Case No.45 of 2010, on the file of learned Additional Special Judge, Nimapara, stands quashed in respect of the present petitioners in exercise of power under Section 482 Cr.P.C.
