2. Heard Mr. P.K. Dash, learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Additional Standing Counsel.

3. Alleging non-compliance of the order dated 10.07.2019 passed by the Odisha Administrative Tribunal, Bhubaneswar in O.A. No.2006 of 2019, the instant writ petition has been filed for compliance of the aforesaid order.

Considering the limited grievance of the petitioner and without issuing notice to the opposite parties, it is directed that let the opposite parties comply with the direction dated 10.07.2019 passed by the Odisha Administrative Tribunal, Bhubaneswar in O.A. No. 2006 of 2019 within a period of three months, if the same has not yet been complied with in the meantime.

5. With the aforesaid observation/direction, the writ petition stands disposed of.
