This matter is taken up through video conferencing mode.

2. Mr. S.S.K. Nayak, learned counsel for the petitioner stated that the petitioner may be permitted to withdraw the writ petition with liberty to file a fresh representation before the authority highlighting the grievances, and the same may be directed to be disposed of within a stipulated time to which learned State Counsel has no objection.

3. As agreed by learned counsel for the parties, this Court directs the petitioner to file a fresh representation within a period of seven days from today ventilating his grievances before the authority. In the event, the petitioner files such representation along with this order, the authority shall consider and pass appropriate order in accordance with law within a period of two months thereafter.

4. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the writ

petition is disposed of.
