1. This matter is taken up through Video Conferencing mode.
2. This is an application under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure filed by the Petitioners for bail in connection with Polasara P.S.Case No.327 of 2020, corresponding to G.R. Case No.586 of 2020, pending in the Court of the learned J.M.F.C., Polasara for alleged commission of offence under Sections 454/380 of the Indian Penal Code.
3. Upon consideration of the submissions made by the respective parties as well as on perusal of the records and on consideration of the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that the petitioners are languishing in jail custody since 17.01.2021 and the fact that stolen articles have been recovered, I am inclined to release the Petitioners on bail in the above case, on furnishing a bail bond of Rs.30,000/- (Rupees Thirty thousand) with one local solvent surety each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned court in seisin over the matter subject to condition that the Petitioners shall not indulge in such type of offence while on bail

and shall appear before the concerned Police Station once in a week preferably on Sunday between 10 A.M. and 1 P.M. till completion of trial. Further, it is open to the court in seisin over the matter to impose any additional condition (s), if situation so warrants.

4. The BLAPL is accordingly disposed of.

5. As the restrictions due to resurgence of COVID -19 situation are continuing, learned counsel for the parties may utilize a print out of the order available in the High Court's website, at par with certified copy, subject to attestation by the concerned Advocate, in the manner prescribed vide Court's Notice No.4587, dated 25th March, 2020, modified by Court's Notice No.4798, dated 15th April, 2021, and Court's Office Order circulated vide Memo Nos.514 and 515 dated 7th January, 2022.
