01. This matter is taken up through Hybrid arrangement (video conferencing/physical mode).

Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that petitioner no.2 Malaya Mallick, petitioner no.3 Bijaya Kumar Mallick and petitioner no.4 Khirod Chandra Mallick have already been arrested.

In view of such submission, this anticipatory bail application so far as petitioner nos.2, 3 and 4 are concerned stands disposed of as infructuous.

Learned counsel for the State submits that there are two injured persons in this case, namely, Bharat Chandra Mallick and Chhaila Mallick and both of them have sustained

simple injuries.

Considering the nature of injuries sustained by the injured and the submission made by the learned counsel for the petitioners that due to political dispute between the parties on account of the last Gram Panchayat election, the case has been foisted, I am inclined to release the petitioners no.1, 5 and 6 on anticipatory bail and accordingly, this Court directs that in the event of arrest of the petitioner no.1 Ajaya Kumar Mallick, petitioner no.5 Rashmikanta Mallick and petitioner no.6 Gagan Bihari mallick in connection with the aforesaid case, they shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(rupees ten thousand) each with two sureties each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the arresting officer with further conditions that they shall make themselves available for interrogation by the I.O. as and when required and they shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing any facts to the Courts or to the Investigating Officer.

Violation of any of the above conditions shall entail cancellation of bail.

The ABLAPL is accordingly disposed of.
