2. Heard.

3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to the opposite parties to grant the petitioner all the service benefits, i.e. Annual Increments, M.A.C.P., seniority in service and promotion as per the settled position of law laid down under Annexure-7.

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievance, the petitioner has made representation to the opposite party no.1 vide Annexure-9 and direction may be given to consider and dispose of the same, taking into consideration Annexure-7, within a stipulated time, to which learned Standing Counsel for School & Mass Education Department has no objection.

As agreed to by learned counsel for the parties, this Court without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the writ petition directing the opposite party no.1 to take a decision on the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-9, taking into consideration Annexure-7 and pass appropriate order in accordance with law, within a period of three months from the date of production of certified copy of this order by the petitioner.
