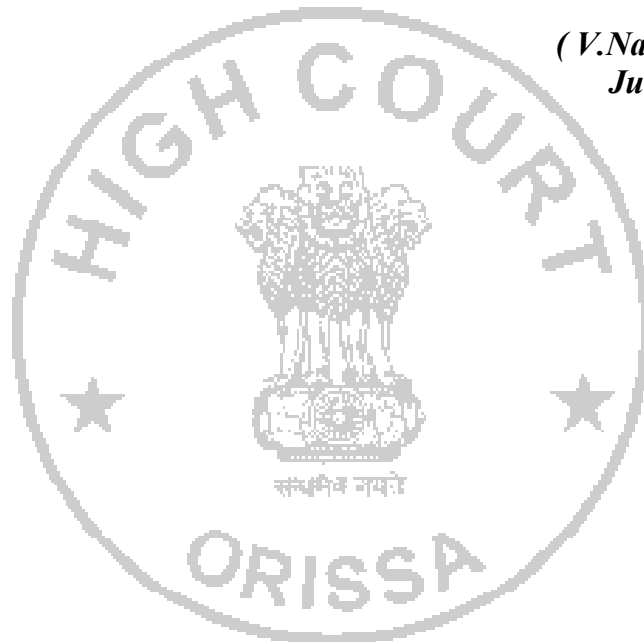
1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Mode.
