02. This matter is taken up through Hybrid arrangement (video conferencing/physical mode).

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned counsel for the State.

This is an application under section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in connection with G.R. Case No.250 of 2022 arising out of Gaisilat P.S. Case No.58 of 2022 pending in the Court of learned S.D.J.M., Padampur for alleged commission of offences under sections 143/147/148/341/323/427/307/325/395/149 of the Indian Penal Code.

Perused the F.I.R.

Learned counsel for the State on instruction submitted that there are two injured persons in this case,

one is informant Basant Kumar Khatei and the other is Manas Kumar Panda and both of them have sustained simple injuries. However, he has not received instruction about the criminal antecedents against the petitioners.

Considering the submissions made by the learned counsel for the respective parties, the nature of accusation against the petitioners and the nature of injury sustained by the injured, I am inclined to release the petitioners on anticipatory bail and accordingly, this Court directs that in the event of arrest of the petitioners in connection with the aforesaid case, they shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (rupees ten thousand) each with two sureties each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the arresting officer with further conditions that they shall make themselves available for interrogation by the I.O. as and when required and they shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to the Investigating Officer.

Violation of any of the above conditions shall entail cancellation of bail.

The ABLAPL is accordingly disposed of.
