- 01.** 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical) Mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel for the Opposite Parties.
3. The Petitioner has filed the present Writ Petition with the following prayer:-

“It is therefore, most humbly prayed that this Hon’ble Court may graciously be pleased to:-

- i) Admit and allow the writ application;*
- ii) Direct the Opp. Party No.4 & 5 to release subsistence allowance for the period from 07.02.2020 to 02.09.2021 and arrear up-to-date salary w.e.f. 03.09.2021 without further delay and/or within a time limit as deem fit and proper by this Hon’ble Court.*
- iii) Direct the Opp. Party No. 2 to dispose of the representation dtd.19.04.2022 as under Annexure-7 (series) within a time stipulated by this Hon’ble Court.*

And/or issue any other appropriate writ/writs, order/orders, direction/directions as deem fit and proper in the fitness of the case;

And for which act of kindness, the petitioner shall as in duty bound ever pray”

4. Learned counsel for the Petitioner further submits that through highlighting his grievances, the petitioner has filed a representation on 19.04.2022 at Annexure-7 to the Writ Petition before the O.P. No.2, but till date nothing has been done in the matter. In such background, learned counsel for the Petitioner prays that a direction be issued to Opposite Party No.2 to take a decision on the above noted petition within a specific time period.

5. Considering the submissions made and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court directs Opposite Party No.2 to take a decision on the above noted petition in accordance with law within a period of three months from the date of receipt of this order and communicate the result of such exercise to the Petitioner.

6. The Writ Petition is disposed of accordingly.
