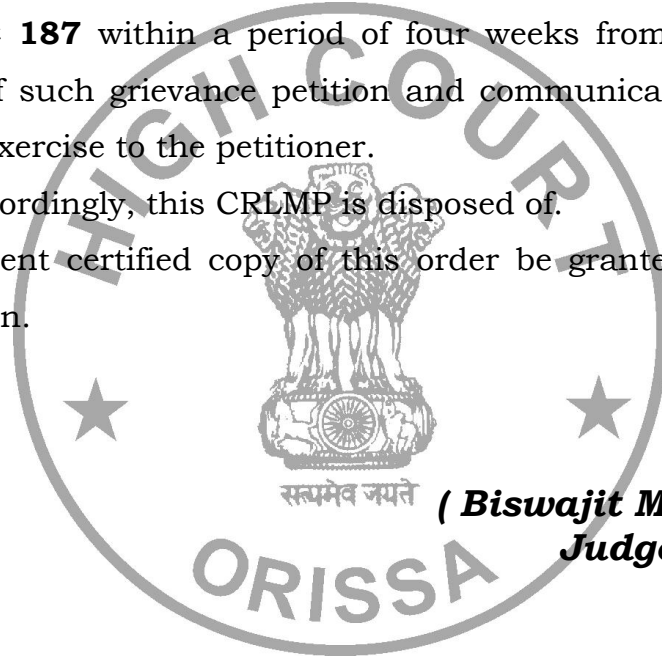

1. Heard Mr. G. Singh, learned counsel assisted by Mr. U.C. Behera, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. D.K. Mohanty, learned Additional Standing Counsel.
 2. According to Mr. Singh, the petitioner who happens to be a lady is aggrieved by the non-registration of her complaint dated 14.06.2022 under Annexure-1 as F.I.R. though the same reveals commission of cognizable offences. He further submits that though the complaint under Annexure-1 was submitted before the Officer-in-Charge, Krishnanandapur Outpost however, when nothing was done, the petitioner has approached the I.I.C., Tirtol Police Station (opposite party No.3) for registration of complaint. Further when nothing was done, though he has approached the Superintendent of Police, Jagatsinghpur (opposite party No.2) on 25.06.2022 under Annexure-2 series in his personal capacity however, he submits that liberty may be granted to the petitioner to file a fresh grievance petition before the Superintendent of Police,

Jagatsinghpur (opposite party No.2) and further prays that the said opposite party be directed to take a decision on such motion within a specific time period.

3. Considering the submissions made and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court grants liberty to the petitioner to file a grievance petition before opposite party No.2 through registered post within a period of two weeks from today. In the event, such a petition is filed along with a copy of this order, the opposite party No.2 is directed to take a decision on the same in accordance with law keeping in mind the decision of the Supreme Court in the case of **Lalita Kumari Vs. State of U.P. & Others** reported in **AIR 2014 SC 187** within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of such grievance petition and communicate the result of such exercise to the petitioner.

4. Accordingly, this CRLMP is disposed of.

5. Urgent certified copy of this order be granted on proper application.
