- 01.** 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical) Mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel for the Opposite Parties.
3. The Petitioner has filed the present Writ Petition with the following prayer:-

“Under the aforesaid facts and circumstances, it is therefore most humbly prayed that your Lordships may graciously be pleased:-

- (i) *To admit the writ application.*
- (ii) *Call for the records.*
- (iii) *Issue a writ of mandamus or any other appropriate writ/writs, order/orders, direction/directions directing the opposite parties more particularly the opposite party No. 3 to take a decision on the representation of this petitioner dated 16.05.2022 under Annexure-6 and further direct to give appointment to the son of the petitioner in Khurda Depot under OSBCL within a time stipulated fixed by this Hon'ble Court;*

And further be pleased to pass any other appropriate writ/writs, direction/directions as would be deem fit and proper;

And for which act of kindness, the Petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray;”

4. Learned counsel for the Petitioner further submits that through highlighting her grievances, the petitioner has filed an application at Annexure-6 to the Writ Petition before the O.P. No.3, but till date nothing has been done in the matter. In such background, learned counsel for the Petitioner prays that a direction be issued to Opposite Party No.3 to take a decision on the above noted Petition within a specific time period.

5. Considering the submissions made and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court directs Opposite Party No.3 to take a decision on the above noted petition in accordance with law within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of this order and communicate the result of such exercise to the Petitioner.

6. The Writ Petition is disposed of accordingly.
