1. Heard Mr. S. Dasmohapatra, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. A.K. Nanda, learned Additional Government Advocate.

2. According to Mr. S. Dasmohapatra, the grievance of the petitioner in this case pertains to non-registration of his complaint dated 10.07.2022 under Annexure-1 series as F.I.R. by the I.I.C., of Bharatpur Police Station, Khandagiri (Opposite Party No.4). Against such inaction, though the petitioner has approached the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Bhubaneswar (Opposite Party No.3) by sending a grievance petition dated 26.07.2022 under Annexure-2 through E-mail on the same date, however, till date no action has been taken on the same. In such background, he prays that necessary direction be given to the Opposite Party No.3 to take a decision on the said grievance petition within a specific time period.

3. Considering the submissions made and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court directs the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Bhubaneswar (Opposite Party No.3) to

take a decision on the grievance petition dated 26.07.2022 under Annexure-2 in accordance with law keeping in the mind the decision of the Supreme Court in the case of ***Lalita Kumari v. Govt. of U.P. & Others*** reported in ***AIR 2014 SC 187*** within a period of four weeks from the date of production of certified copy of this order, if in the meantime, the same has not been already disposed of. The petitioner is directed to supply copies of the complaint under Annexure-1 series as well as grievance petition under Annexure-2 to the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Bhubaneswar (Opposite Party No.3) while presenting a certified copy of this order. Opposite Party No.3 is directed to communicate the result of such exercise to the petitioner.

4. The CRLMP is accordingly disposed of.
5. Urgent certified copy of this order be granted as per rule.
