1. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the parties.
2. This writ petition involves the following prayer:

“It is therefore, prayed that this Hon’ble Court may graciously be pleased to issue Rule NISI calling upon the Opp. Parties to show cause as to why the representation dt.11.12.2020 vide Annexure-1 Series shall not be considered Issue writ of mandamus or any appropriate writ/writs, direction/directions by directing the Opp.Party No.2 (Collector, Jagatsinghpur) to consider the representation dt.11.12.2020 anenxure-1 series, sent on dt.11.12.2020 by registered post is pending for disposal for last 18 months regarding given a directing to the Opposite party no.3)Tahasildar, Raghunathpur) to accept the form no.25 (application form for conversion filed by the petitioner no.1) and with all annexures (Annexure-5 series) and after numbering the same, after due inquiry passed a reasonable order.

- i. If the Opp. Parties fail to show or show insufficient cause to make the rule absolute.
- ii. And to pass such other order/orders and writ/writs which would afford complete relief to the petitioner.
