2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

3. The petitioner has filed this writ petition seeking direction to opposite party no.2 to finalize the gradation list of J.C. employees of Keonjhar Settlement wing immediately wherein the petitioner is entitled at Sl. No.4 pursuant to letter under Annexure-4 and regularize his service giving all pensionary benefits.

In course of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner states that highlighting the grievances, the petitioner has made representation to opposite party no.2 vide Annexures-5 & 6 and the same may be directed to be considered and disposed of within a stipulated time to which learned State Counsel has no objection.

As agreed by learned counsel for the parties, this Court, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the writ petition directing opposite party no.2 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexures-5 & 6 and pass appropriate order in accordance with law within a period of three months from the date of production of authenticated copy this order.
